1. Think of a time you climbed a mountain. What was it like to hike and hike and finally reach the top? What did you see?
2. Can you draw a symbol to remember each of the 6 mountain peaks of God’s “promise-plan”? For example: a snake crushed by a cross (Genesis 1-3), rainbow (Genesis 6-9), stars (Genesis 12), stone tablets (Exodus 19-20), a throne (2 Samuel 7), and a heart (Jeremiah 31).
3. True or False. The law was like a prison warden keeping God’s people in protective custody until Jesus Christ was revealed. It was also like a guardian making sure the people stayed “schooled” in the application of the law.

“The mysterious promise on page three of the Bible promises a deliverer would one day come to confront evil and rescue humanity. We trace this theme through the family of Abraham, and ultimately to Jesus who defeated evil by letting it defeat him” (The Bible Project).
