4. Jeremiah was called as a prophet by God to warn Judah of God’s judgement. What was the people’s disobedience?
5. Despite their disobedience, God hasn’t abandoned His people. Underline what God is going to do according to Jeremiah 31:31. *“The days are coming,” declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah.*”
6. Verse 33 says, *“I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.”* What was the law first written upon? Why would it be better to have the law written on our hearts instead?
7. True or False. According to verse 34, only small children from the North Pole with pointed ears will have complete and equal access to God through Jesus Christ.
